"So I turn it and him off." Many teenagers similarly withdraw into their own private world, being unable to communicate with their parents. In one extensive study of teens, 26% of them said, "I try to stay away from home most of the time." The result is a huge gap formed between teens and parents.

But it's important to realize that our parents are human too, in itself is a big step in helping to understand them. They may be afraid of the different peer pressures that we face at school. They may not complain about financial problems and on-the-job difficulties but these always exist. We must always try to give them the benefit of the doubt. After all we do not like other people judging us without a fair trial.

This is an exercise that requires in depth study of the issues, weeks of research, speachwriting and study of the parties of which they 11 be members, and the political system in which they'll play a part.

It is to this political forum, the House of Parliament, that the Canadian people elect representatives that they believe have the capability to aid in the management of the complex political machine that devises federal laws, creates foreign policies and governs interprovincial affairs. In all this the Canadian electorate expects their member of parliament to represent their needs and safeguard their interests They therefore chose candidates that hold the same moral standards. ethical beliefs and political convictions that they do. In Canada, the charter guarantees you the right, whether you are of voting age or not, to express your opinions as to the way society and its institutions should be organized. The various political parties that are represented in the provincial and federal forums

across this country are proof that

voters exercise this right. But do

you? Whether or not you are an adult, you are free to express your political opinions without penalty. This ranges from your opinion on the running of the country (and those who run it), to the expression of your beliefs relating to "the organization of the school either personally or through the student association". Whether you express your convictions verbally, in assignments or in the school newspaper, the COMMISSION DES DROITS DE LA PERSONNE DU OUEBEC guarantees you that this be free from any penalty, because the expression of "one's own political convictions" is protected by law. It is this freedom that allows for the existence of differing political groups within a community and a nation. It is the shift in a country's political orientation that allows it to grow and change over time. It is the formation and expression of the political beliefs of the young that lead to the difference in politics between one generation and another. The E/H class breeds political awareness in a small group each year, but by age

Bantam Girls and Bantam Boys Basketball



I could almost fly.


